# YOUTH PROGRAMS FALL 2014

Classes are for youths of ages 11–17. All classes take place on the Cranford campus.

**Schedule:** Classes take place on Saturdays. No classes run on November 8 and November 29.

**Student Drop-off/Pick-up:** Parents/guardians must go to the classroom to drop off and pick up children at the assigned classroom. Children must be picked up on time.

## AGES 11–13 YEARS

### Design Your Own Comic Book/ Graphic Novel (12 hrs)

Learn about developing characters, structuring a story, designing the visual layout and eye-catching covers. Materials needed: 11"x14" spiral sketchpad, pencils: H, 2H, B, 2B, color pencils, erasers and 24 pack of markers. \$149

### Graffiti Art/Design Projects (12 hrs)

Learn how to apply your Cartooning and Graphic Art skills to canvas and simulated wall surfaces made from styrofoam and plaster to create beautiful and displayable works of art. Students will be shown techniques for developing their characters and lettering designs into original, colorful and finished compositions. Required materials: Ebony pencil, fine point Sharpie marker, 9" x 12" or 11" x 14" sketch pad, three artist paint brushes ( fine, medium and large ) and five tubes of acrylic paint ( black, white, yellow, red and blue ). Then, each word problem will be broken down into a numeric expression the student will solve. Students will be pre-tested to determine placement, level and need.

Materials: No.2 pencils, erasers, extra-fine point Sharpie markers, 9"x12" or 11"x14" (heavy weight) drawing pads, colored pencils.
